

Association of Airworthiness Professionals Ethics Code

Preamble

The Ethics Code of the Association of Airworthiness Professionals was developed to provide members of the Association with some broad ethical statements with which to guide their professional lives and to identify relevant considerations when ethical uncertainties arise.

This Code does not supersede or take precedence over your regular workplace Ethics policy.

Fundamental Principles

Airworthiness Professionals uphold and advance the integrity, honor and dignity of the airworthiness profession by:

- *Being honest and impartial;*
- *Maintaining the highest levels of integrity;*
- *Keeping informed on standing airworthiness authority requirements and the reasons for any changes to those requirements;*
- *Striving to increase the competence and prestige of the profession;*
and
- *Supporting the professional and technical societies of their disciplines.*

Rules of Practice

- *Respect, protect and preserve the intellectual property of others.*
- *Give prudent advice. Be truthful, objective, and maintain your professional and technical integrity.*
- *Respect the trust and privileges granted to you.*
- *Act legally, honorably, honestly, justly and responsibly.*

- *Avoid conflicts of interest and the appearance thereof.*
